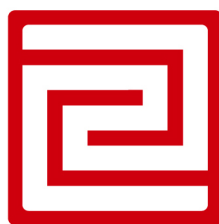

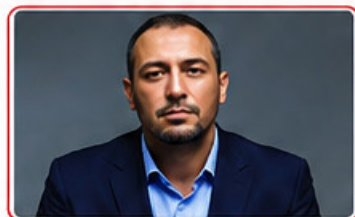

Electricity Supply
